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Improved cookstoves: Vita's experience

- Vita: 60,000 households reached
- Global target of 100 Million ICS by 2020
- Scale up needed



 Research explored how community-led approach can mobilise communities to adopt cookstoves






Fig. 1: Numbers of deaths attributable to household air pollution, Ethiopia Source: WHO, 2018



What is Community-Led Total Sanitation?

Involves everyone in the community

Collective community decision & action

Emergence of Natural Leaders

Prompts self-realization

Local innovations

Not dependent on external subsidies or prescriptions

Findings and next steps:

- Communities formed committees after triggering
- 40+ people trained in approach
- Pilot approach in 50 villages in late 2019

Learning questions:

- Drivers of adoption/ non-adoption
- Gender preferences: Cooks & household decision makers
- Access vs. affordability



Conclusion

- 1. Ability to scale up is urgently needed
- 2. Communities can mobilise themselves to move to cleaner cooking after triggering
- CLT-Stoves ☐ Huge potential to increase uptake of cleaner cookstoves
