# Conflict interrupts Health Service delivery in West Darfur, Sudan – Concern with partners overcoming challenges

### **Programme Objectives**

The overall objective is to improve the living conditions of IDPs, returnees and local communities, by addressing the root causes of irregular and forced migration by:

Strengthening local health systems

 to deliver a basic package of health services in West Darfur and to create a more conducive and sustainable living environment for host & displaced popula

Strengthening governance capacity of states

and local authorities for a well-functioning and sustainable health system;

- Improving access and quality of primary health care
  - including nutrition services
- Creating a more participatory and inclusive health system throug involvement of local communities
- ☐ Specific Programme Objective: To improve the provision of basic health and nutrition services for vulnerable populations in West Darfur.



#### **Current humanitarian context in Sudan**

#### 42.6 million people in Sudan

- 8.5 million people in need of humanitarian assistance (USAID 2019)
- 5.7 million (USAID 2018) ☐ more than 1/3 increase
- 2 to 2.3 million <u>IDPs</u> in need of humanitarian assistance □ 1.8 million in <u>Darfur</u>
- Currently 41% of the population lives in IDP camps or hard-to-reach areas, limiting access to essential health and nutrition services.
- The target group under this action is estimated at Kulbus Locality 112,340 and in Jebel Moon Locality 31,098 people.



# Conflict interrupts health service delivery



#### 1) Economic challenges:

- ☐ high inflation rates
- ☐ limited cash availability in the banks

#### 2) Political upheaval:

- ☐ civil protest starting in Dec. 2018 led to ousting of yr. Al-Bashir regime in Apr. 2019
  - ☐ restricted travel permission since Apr. 2019
  - □disputes btw. nomads& farmers at field sites







## Service delivery – despite challenges, ongoing:

- a) Capacity building training for mother support groups & traditional birth attendants completed & health education provided by local partner (CDA)
- b) Renovation of LHA buildings in Kulbus & Jebel Moon
- c) Outreach EPI implemented with SMoH staff
- d) Medical supplies delivered:
- Concern registered with National Medical Supplies Fund (NMSF) online system with IMC
  - Purchased essential medicine from NMSF for the two targeted localities
- e) 11 health facilities operational again, providing essential PHC services
- f) Increasing awareness & education on the National Health Insurance Fund



# Overcoming challenges - How did Concern & partners address the political & economic challenges?

- Fuel crisis: WFP released fuel for field operations, incl. CMAM activities;
- Cash crisis: engagement with suppliers & contractors with cash flows; organised joint trainings with IMC with the support of SMoH;
- Improved coordination with SMoH, IMC, UNICEF and WHO to stay on track to more effectively implement national MoH policy changes;
- Engaged with MSF Sudan for obtaining medicines in-country during stock-outs (approved by EUTF/WHO);
- Concern Sudan maintained a cordial relationship and communication with the West Darfur State authorities throughout;



# Conflict breaks health systems...yet.....

Concern Sudan remains committed to delivering on the EUTF project with SMoH, IMC and CDA partners;

 CMAM activities are now being integrated in the Health Facilities with the support of UNICEF;

Plan is to complete remaining training and capacity building with LHA and SMoH staff;

 Preparation of Community Health Committees for sustainability by linking them to SMoH;

Promoting National Health Insurance Fund/NHIF take-up in West Darfur to increase coverage
